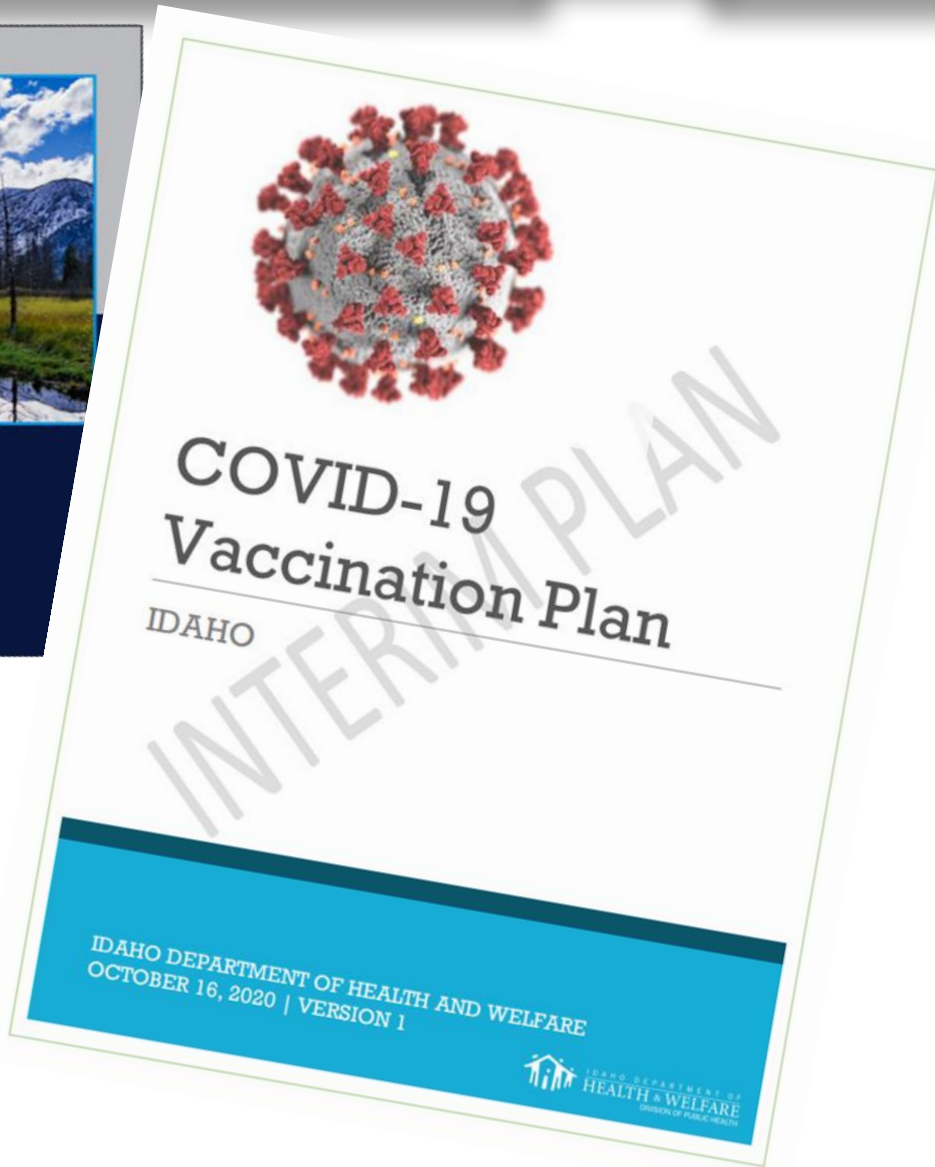
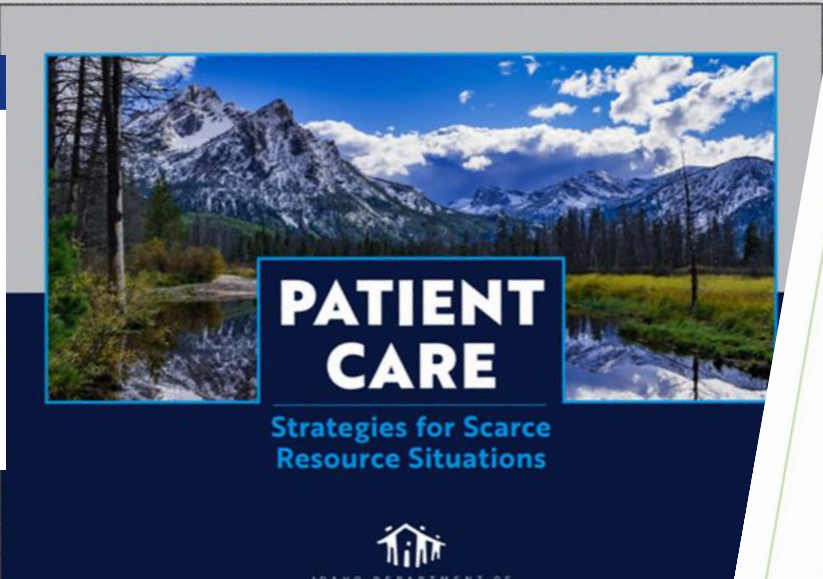

COVID-19 TESTING RECOMMENDATIONS

State of Idaho Testing Task Force

Herein are captured the current recommendations for molecular and serologic testing for COVID-19. We note that the science of testing for this condition will continue to evolve as will knowledge around transmission and immunity. For this reason, it will be important that these recommendations are part of a living document, capturing our best recommendations at this time, and requiring frequent and regular update.

Mandatory Use of Face Coverings in Long-term Care Facilities in Idaho

Governor Little's Stay Healthy Order, effective October 27, 2020, requires the universal use of face coverings in long-term care facilities in Idaho. The order applies to anyone who is not a resident of that facility. The order specifically states that:

1. Anyone who enters a long-term care facility or campus who is not a resident is required to wear a face covering that covers their nose and mouth at all times.
2. Exemptions. This requirement does not apply to:
 - a. Children under the age of 5;
 - b. Any person while consuming food or drink;
 - c. Any person with a diagnosed medical condition, mental health condition, or disability which prevents wearing a face covering; or
 - d. Any person who is deaf or hard of hearing for purposes of communication, or any person communicating with a person who is deaf or hard of hearing.
