

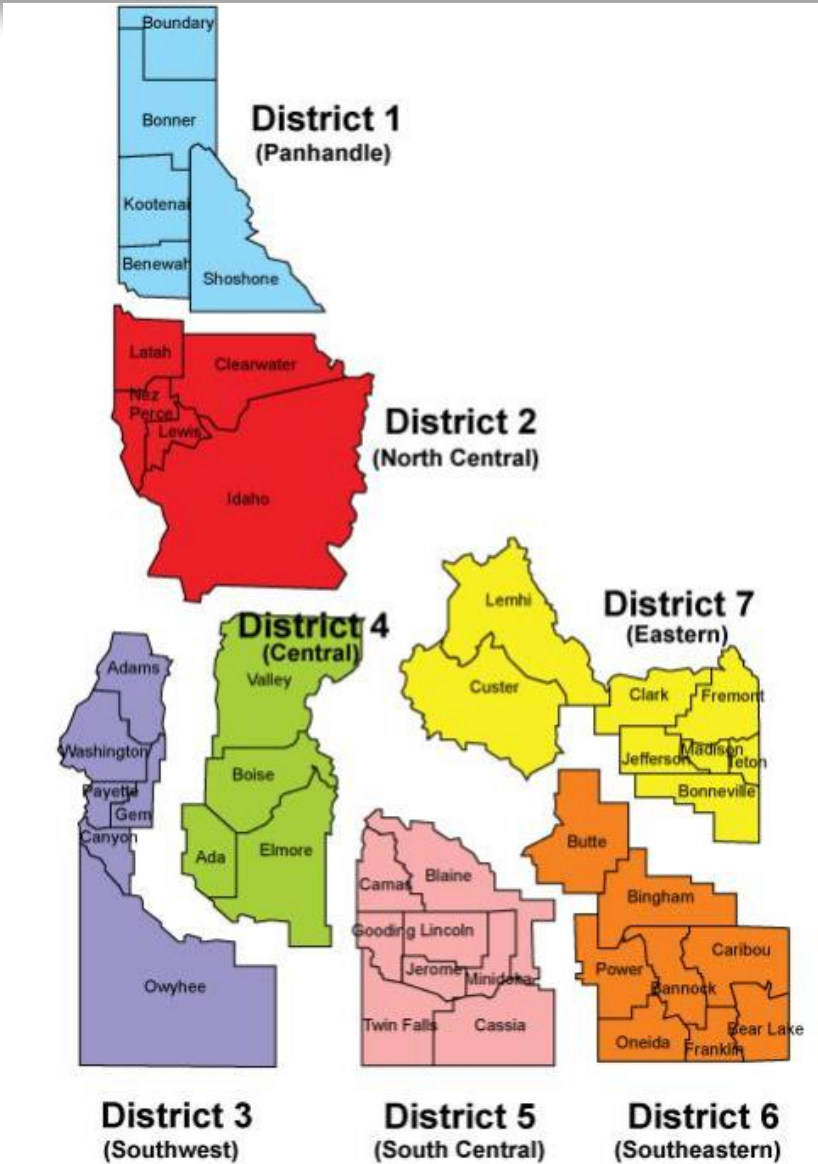

COVID-19 Survey Answers, 12/11/2020

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| PHD1 | Facilities receiving the vaccine will store appropriately utilizing their own ultra-cold freezers (UCFs). We will be using the dry ice method as we do not have an UCF. We will use the Digital Data Logger for verifying the appropriate temperature. |
| PHD2 | Receive shipment. Refresh dry ice. Within 12 hours, PHD2 will redistribute to 5 hospitals in the jurisdiction transporting by car. Staff will observe removal and handling of vaccine into hospital refrigerator. Hospital will be required to administer all doses within 5 days. |
| PHD3 | A secure location has been identified in the district and will store shipment in their pharmacy with a PharmaWatch temperature gauge on their existing UCF. 24/7 security on the premises. Redistribution of the vaccine will be facilitated by PHD3. |
| PHD4 | HCPs receiving and storing vaccine will follow Pfizer guidance for storage and handling of the ultra-cold chain vaccine. HCPs will utilize facility UCFs and/or the shipping container recharging with dry ice. |
| PHD5 | Follow the manufacture's storage guidelines in UCF with monitoring system in place. Dry ice MOU in place. North Canyon Medical Center and Cassia Regional both have an UCF. |
| PHD6 | PHD6 plans to have several individuals trained on safe storage, transport, and dispensing procedures to include protocols for temperature monitoring, safe handling, and tracking needs associated with the vaccine. |
| PHD7 | PHD7 will be storing the vaccine in our UCF located at our facility. We will be adhering to procedures provided by federal entities for vaccine storage. |

- Reminder—we are 5 days into vaccination roll-out for a pandemic that started in Idaho over 9 months ago.

- Limitations in Week One:
 - 975 dose minimum per shipment for Pfizer vaccine
 - 5-day window to vaccinate when doses are re-distributed in smaller quantities
 - Limited doses statewide
 - Fluid environment
 - Doses available to the state
 - Priorities changing



- Engaging with hospitals, healthcare personnel, and Long Term Care Facilities not enrolled with a pharmacy partner to facilitate vaccination.
- Providing referrals to the Idaho Immunization Program for medical partners considering enrolling to provide vaccinations.
 - Unsure how many providers will enroll, makes planning challenging
- Planning and preparing for vaccination clinics as vaccine becomes more readily available to other priority groups.
