- ACIP makes recommendations to CDC on immunizations in the US civilian population
- CDC then decides whether to adopt ACIP recommendations and publish them in MMWR
- States may choose to follow ACIP/CDC recommendations with sub-prioritization, or implement their own prioritization groups
- CVAC provides recommendations to the Governor
- Ultimately Governor has decision-making authority

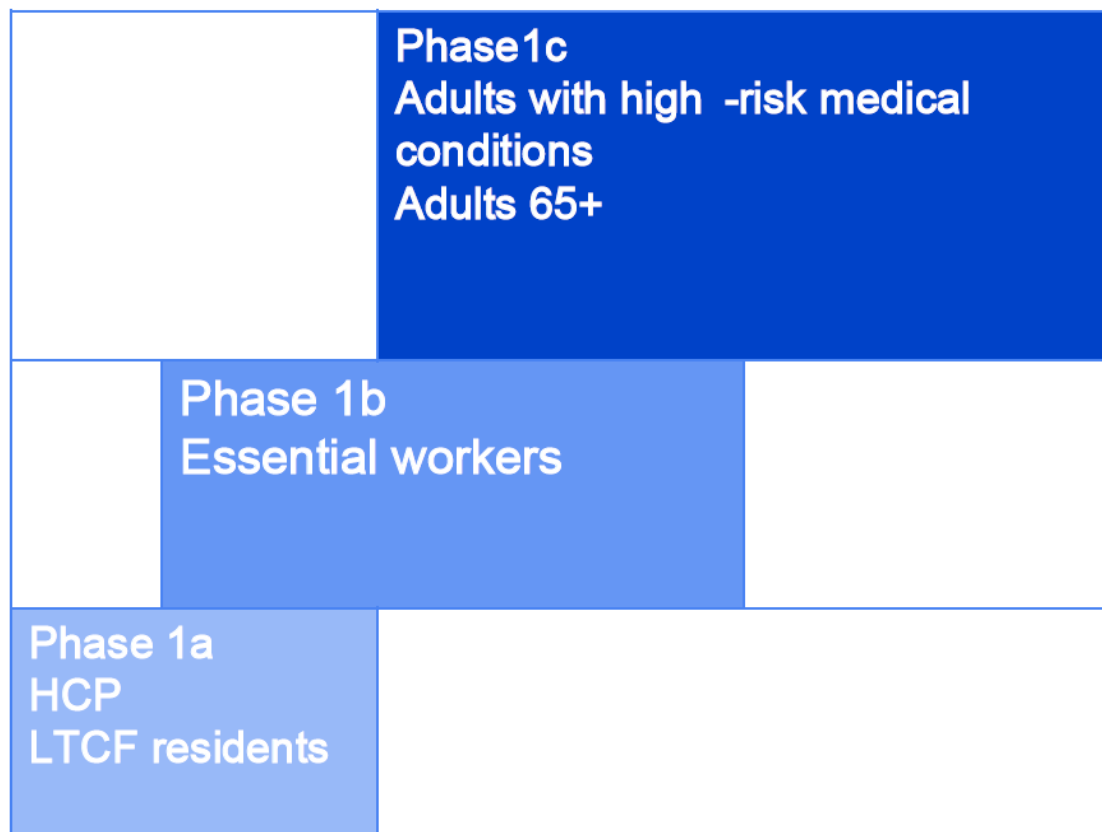

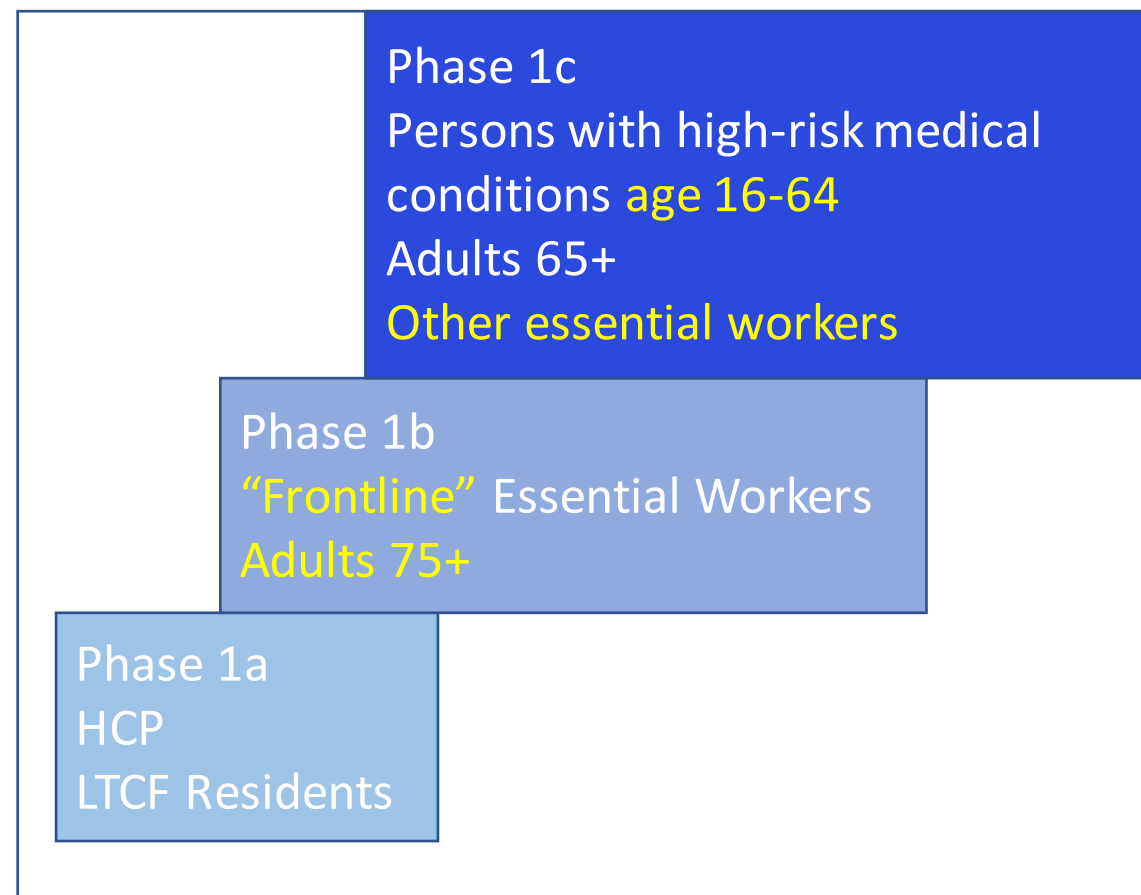

Frontline Essential Workers: workers who are in sectors essential to the functioning of society and are at substantially higher risk of exposure to SARS-CoV-2
