Transitioning Between Phases: Considerations

Jurisdictions may consider expanding vaccine availability to priority groups in the next phase in several situations, including, for example:

- Demand in the current phase appears to be decreasing (e.g., decrease in appointments)
- Supply exceeds population number (e.g., more vaccine doses available than needed to complete vaccination of persons in the current phase)
- Most people in the current phase are vaccinated (e.g., 70% of the target population in a phase)
- Jurisdictions have actively worked to increase both access and demand among populations in a specific phase but vaccine supply still exceeds demand
- Vaccine supply within a certain location is in danger of going unused unless vaccination is expanded to persons in the next phase

Idaho Considerations for Discussion



Idaho COVID-19 Vaccine Program Goals:

- Reduce transmission, severe illness and death
- Preserve functioning of healthcare system
- Recover functioning of society and the economy
- Protect persons at risk who have access and functional needs
- Ensure equitable distribution within groups prioritized for vaccination phases and equity in the opportunity for health and well-being
- Ensure transparency regarding vaccine decision-making

Other Considerations:

- Limited Vaccine Supply Epidemiological data
- Logistics

- Group Discussion
- VOTE for preferred group
- If one proposed group gets a majority, that will be considered final vote
- If no clear winner (e.g. none of the proposed options get >50%, or "none of the above" gets >50%)
 - Further Discussion
 - RE-VOTE on the two with the highest votes, to include new proposals if any
 - Majority rules on the second vote
 - If no conclusion at end of meeting, Governor may use his authority to decide after reviewing the deliberations of today's CVAC meeting



Expected Allocations Moving Forward

- 19,450 Primary Doses Weekly
 - 9,700 doses of Moderna weekly
 - 9,750 doses of Pfizer-BioNTech weekly
- Reserved "second doses" also arrive in this cadence
 - This may change, as of news stories this morning
 - All doses may be pushed out together, rather than reserving some vaccine for second doses
