## Idaho Considerations for Guiding Discussion and Votes

#### Idaho COVID-19 Vaccine Program Goals

- Reduce transmission, severe illness and death
- Preserve functioning of healthcare system
- Recover functioning of society and the economy
- Protect persons at risk who have access and functional needs
- Ensure equitable distribution within groups prioritized for vaccination phases and equity in the opportunity for health and well-being
- Ensure transparency regarding vaccine decision-making

### **Other Considerations:**

- Limited vaccine supply
- Epidemiologic data
- Logistics

- Prepared options will be presented on the following slide, based on new ACIP/CDC recommendations, stakeholder input and public comment
- Group discussion
- VOTE for preferred group
- If one proposed group gets a majority, that will be considered final vote according to CVAC Charter
  - All recommendations go to the Governor for final rejection, modification or approval
  - If no CVAC conclusion at end of meeting, Governor may use his authority to decide after reviewing the deliberations of today's CVAC meeting


