

- 1/04/21 Finalized further clarifications to Healthcare Personnel & LTCF Staff & Residents


State Efforts



- Working with Idaho Office of Emergency Management, FEMA and a federal Incident Management Assistance Team
 - Evaluate capacity for vaccine delivery and assist plan for administration logistics
- Assessing capacity and plans for vaccine administration modalities
 - Readiness for Group 2.3, remaining frontline essential workers
 - Readiness for Group 3 and beyond as well as additional vaccine
- Developing a statewide registration tool

Provider Enrollment Update (as of 02/16/2021)


- 424 Enrolled Provider Locations

Tiberius/Operation Warp Speed

Allocation Increases for Idaho

- 25% increase in Pfizer doses this week (not including the 6th dose/vial)
 - 3 trays (3,510 doses)
- Increases in allocation in Federal Pharmacy Partnership Program
 - Anticipating 10,000 doses for Idaho
 - Adding Cardinal Chain Pharmacies to Walmart & Albertson's/Savon

Note: Extreme weather around the country has impacted shipments this week
