- 1/04/21 Finalized further clarifications to Healthcare Personnel & LTCF Staff & Residents
- 1/08/21 Voted to include 65+ with frontline essential workers in Idaho Group 2

## When and where to get your vaccination



COVID-19 Vaccination

Learn how you can receive a COVID-19 vaccination.



- Starting on February 1, 2021, and continuing thereafter until this order is rescinded or expires by operation of law, IDHW will obtain the following data from each enrolled COVID-19 vaccine provider:
  - a. The total number of doses that a public health district has allocated to the health provider. This information is to be obtained weekly.
  - b. The total number of allocated doses that the health provider has administered. This information is to be obtained daily.
  - c. The total number of allocated doses currently in inventory. This information is to be obtained daily.
- All enrolled COVID-19 vaccine providers are expected to provide the above-referenced information to IDHW in a timely and organized manner.
- All enrolled COVID-19 vaccine providers are expected to administer doses within seven days of receipt.
- Beginning no later than February 8, 2021, IDHW will post the above information for each enrolled COVID-19 vaccine provider within the COVID-19 Vaccine Data Dashboard located at [coronavirus.idaho.gov](https://coronavirus.idaho.gov). IDHW will continue to post the required information every business day thereafter until this order is rescinded or expires by operation of law.
- IDHW shall ensure that no personal health or identifying information of any recipient of a vaccine is posted on its website or otherwise made available to the public.



- Meetings will be open to the public, in a “listen-only” mode. **Public comments** will only be accepted in writing, to a designated email box and comments will be distributed to the members of the committee prior to each meeting, if comments are received by the Monday at noon prior to CVAC Friday meetings.
- ASL Interpreters will be provided at all CVAC meetings. Attendees can pin the interpreter videos by scrolling over their videos, clicking on the three dots in the top right of the video, and selecting **lock a participant to this location**. Should you need the video larger, click on the **layout** option in the upper right-hand corner, then click on **full screen**. Once the full screen appears, a floating window of the panelists will show. You can increase the video size by dragging and expanding.

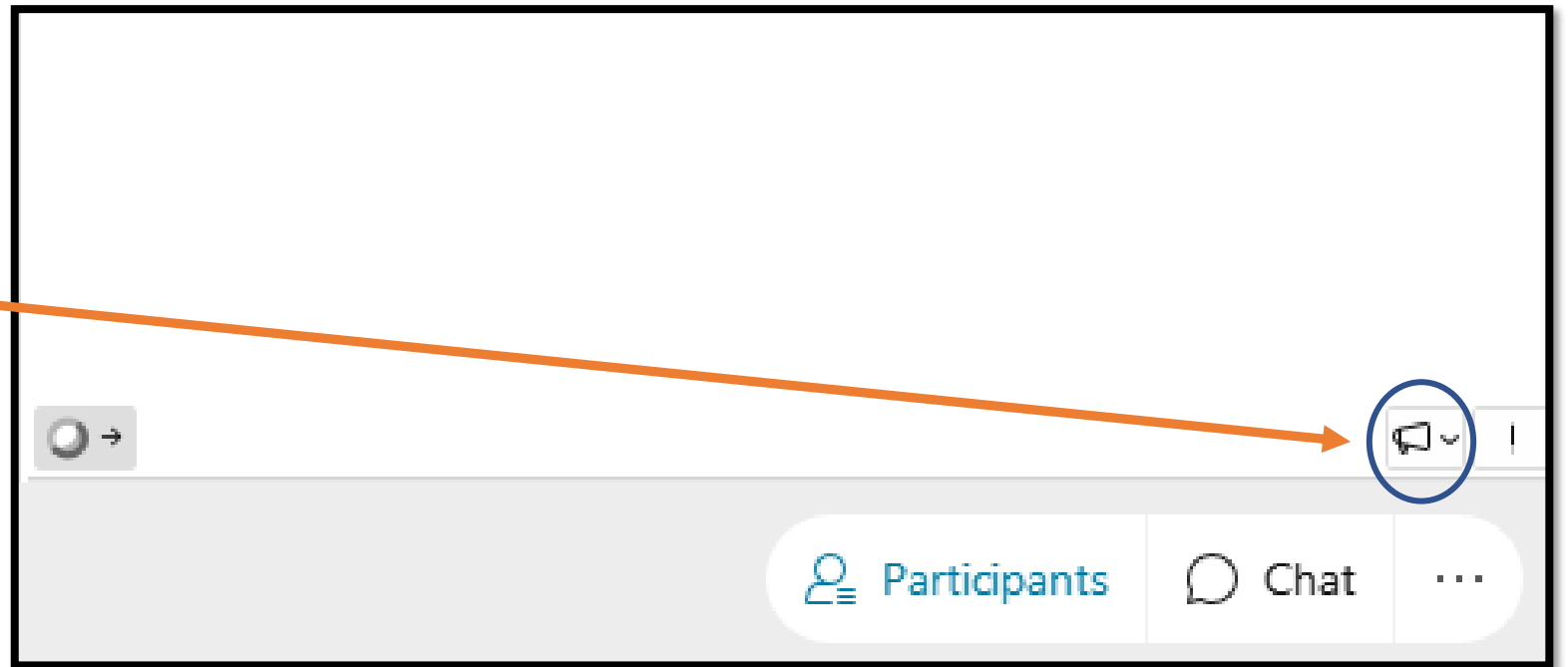

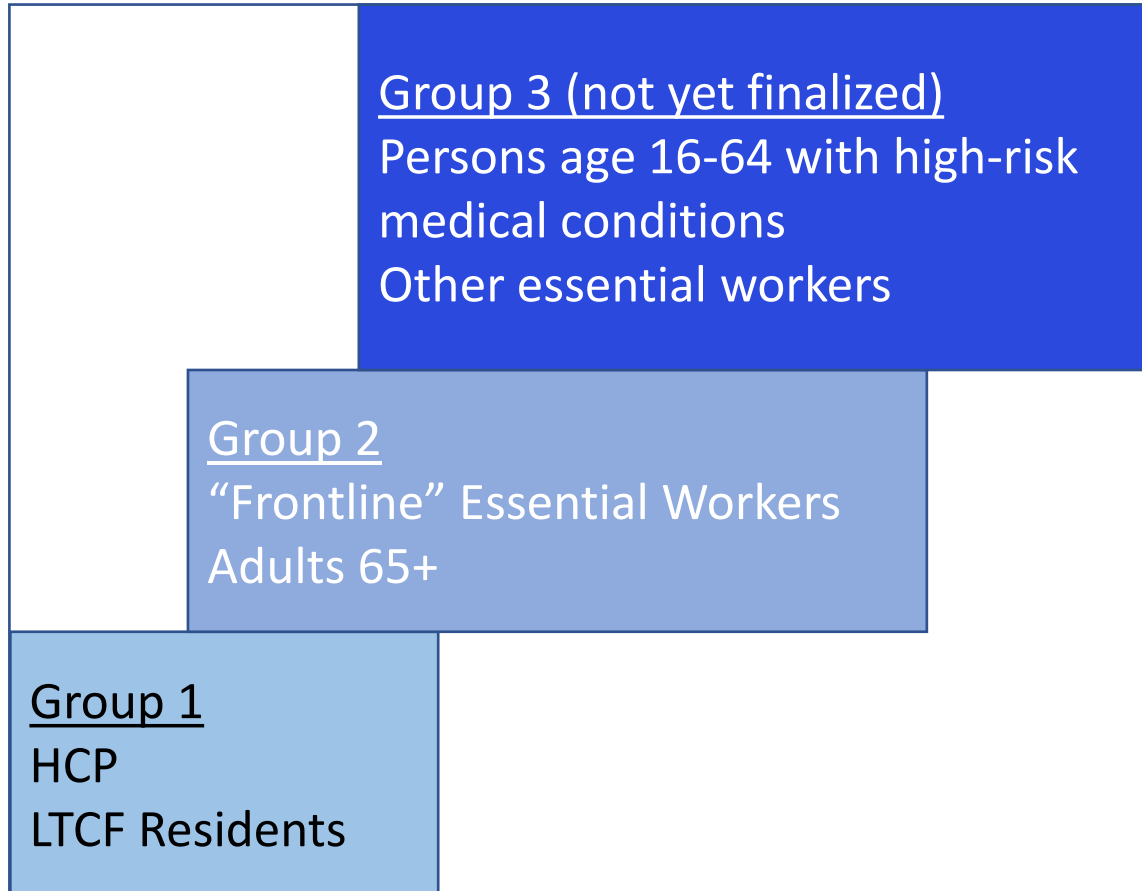

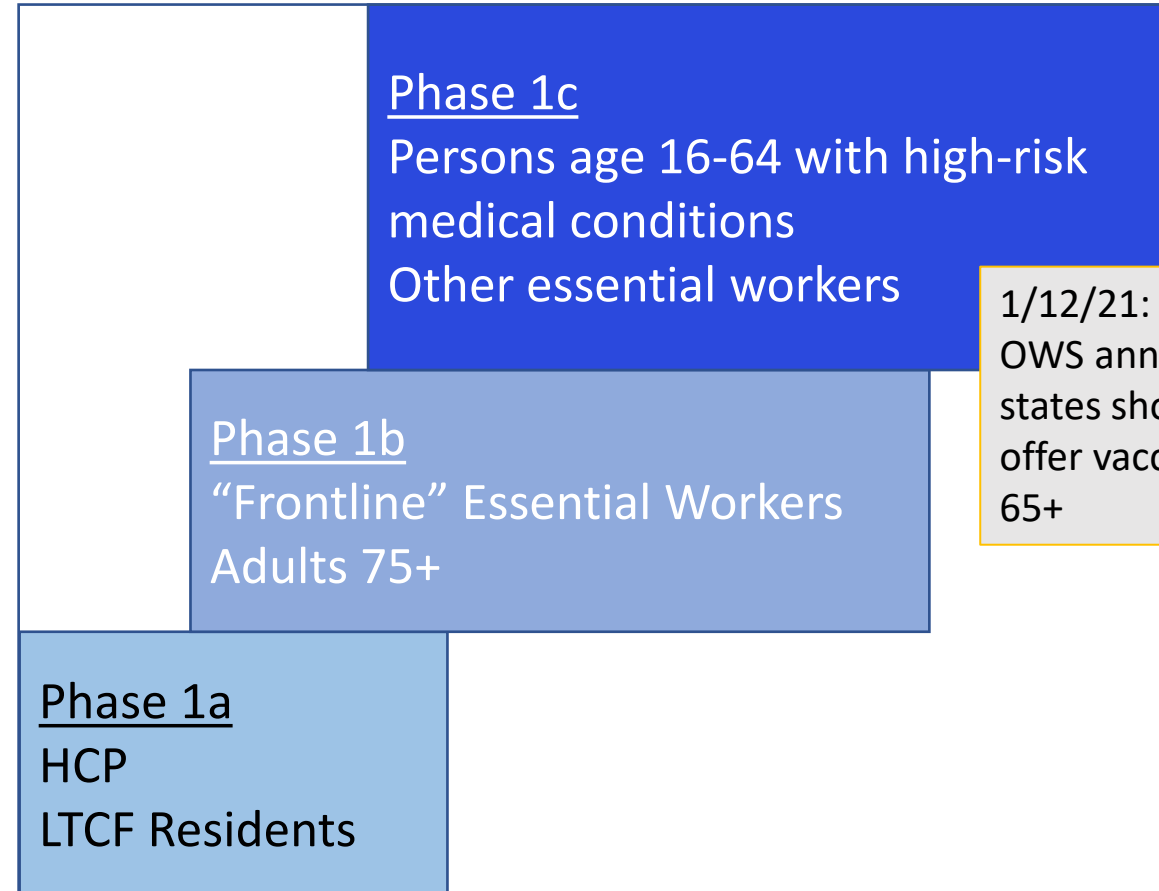

Dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants

Pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and pharmacy aides

Public health and emergency management response workers who are unable to telework (includes Idaho National Guard deployed to support public health response, state and local public health responders who are unable to telework)

**Long-term care facility residents**

(Includes residents of long-term care facilities within correctional or detention settings, residents in certified family homes, and participants in group adult daycare programs)
