

COVID-19 VACCINE BOOSTER DOSES UPDATE

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) have authorized and recommended booster doses for Moderna, Johnson & Johnson, and the Pfizer/BioNtech COVID-19 vaccine.



WHO'S ELIGIBLE FOR THE BOOSTER?

The CDC recommends that *everyone* ages 18 and older *should* get a booster shot. Those who got the Pfizer-BioNTech or the Moderna series, should wait at least six months. Those who got the Johnson & Johnson vaccine should wait at least two months.

A booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine is also *strongly encouraged* for 16- and 17-year-olds who got the two-dose series at least six months ago.

WHERE CAN IDAHOANS GET A BOOSTER?

Boosters are available at pharmacies, clinics, and healthcare providers statewide. They are not available to the public at hospitals. Use the [Vaccine Finder](#) to find locations, the vaccine brands available, and walk-in or appointment details. Neither proof of eligibility nor a prescription is required, and all doses of the COVID-19 vaccine are free of charge.
